<b>5 Point Challenges</b>		
Design a brochure advert for a holiday destination. How are you going to promote and sell this destination? Think about the positive language, what is available there, what activities could people do, local landmarks, local food etc.	Investigate different animals that have adapted to extreme climates. How have they adapted?	Create a fact file about the seven different continents and identify each ones key countries.
<b>4 Point Challenges</b>		
Investigate some remote areas of the British Isles and consider why people live or visit there.	Choose an animal and find out about their habitat. Creatively show your findings.	Design and write a postcard. Consider the picture on one side and what you are going to write about on the other. Don't forget to leave space for the address.
<b>3 Point Challenges</b>		
Compare the UK with a country of your choice. What is similar? What is different?	Label a picture of the earth showing North Pole, South Pole, equator, northern hemisphere and southern hemisphere.	Draw the United Kingdom and label the capital cities. Can you label any other cities or landmarks in the UK?

Keep practising!	<b>TOPIC WORDS</b> Use a dictionary to create a glossary of these key words: Globe, map, atlas, compass, united, population, monarchy, border, trade, pollution, gulf	What is a computer network?
