<p>China Comparisons – Create a fact file comparing China and the UK. Include: climate, landscape, farming, daily life and jobs. Use pictures and short paragraphs.</p>	<p>China in a Box – Create a small model or shoebox scene of a region in China (e.g. mountains, desert, rice fields, city, river valley). Include labels for physical features and how people live there.</p>	<p>Multiplication in Real Life – Find examples of multiplication in your daily life (baking, shopping, sports). Write down or photograph what you find.</p>

<p>A Day in the Life – Write a diary entry as a child living in one part of China (e.g. South China farmer, desert village child, mountain herder, city child in Shanghai). Describe daily life, food, home and work</p>	<p>Mini Documentary – Make a short video (or storyboard) explaining what you've learned about China.</p>	<p>Map Master – Draw a map of China and label at least 5 key features (e.g. Himalayas, Yangtze River, Yellow River, Gobi Desert, coastline). Add symbols and a key.</p>

<p>Flag & Facts – Draw the Chinese flag and write 5 facts about China (location, size, landscapes, climate, population, rivers or mountains).</p>	<p>Kindness Jar – Keep a jar and note every kind thing someone does for you (or you do for others) for a week.</p>	<p>My Favourite Place in China – Draw and label a picture of a place in China you would like to visit. Write 3 sentences explaining why and what the geography/climate is like there.</p>
